**PROCLAMATION LOWERING ALL FLAGS ON GOVERNMENT OF THE VIRGIN
ISLANDS OF THE UNITED STATES' BUILDINGS
TO HALF-STAFF IN HONOR OF THE HONORABLE
JULIO A. BRADY**

A PROCLAMATION

The Honorable Julio A. Brady gave his life to public service having served as Lieutenant Governor of the Virgin Islands of the United States; Attorney General for the Virgin Islands of the United States, United States Attorney for the District of the Virgin Islands of the United States, and most recently as Judge of the Superior Court of the Virgin Islands in the District of St. Croix.

The Honorable Julio A. Brady died on September 16, 2015, and the Virgin Islands community mourns this loss. His distinguished political and legal careers serve as a testament to his commitment to public service and to this Territory. Judge Brady served this community with dedication and distinction, and it is fitting that the flags flown on buildings in the Territory be flown at half-staff.

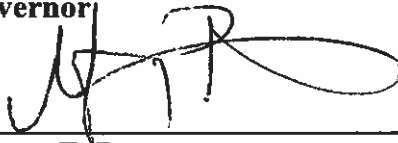
NOW THEREFORE, I, Kenneth E. Mapp, Governor of the Virgin Islands of the United States, by virtue of the authority vested in me by the Revised Organic Act of 1954, as amended, laws of the United States, and the laws of the Virgin Islands of the United States, do hereby proclaim that all flags shall be flown at half-staff at Government House and upon all public buildings and grounds, throughout the Territory until sunset on the day of the interment for the Honorable Julio A. Brady. I urge owners of private and federal buildings in the Territory to fly their flags at half-staff as well in honor of this remarkable public servant.

IN WITNESS WHEREOF, I have hereto set my hand and caused the Seal of the Government of the Virgin Islands of United States to be affixed at Charlotte Amalie, St. Thomas, Virgin Islands this 16th day of September, 2015.
