GRANTING A COMMUTATION OF SENTENCE TO JEREMY M. CHIU-K-DAVIS

BY THE GOVERNOR OF THE UNITED STATES VIRGIN ISLANDS

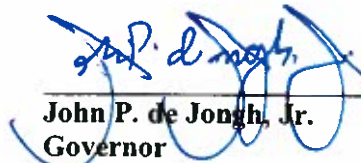
Jeremy M. Chiuk-Davis was born on October 23, 1985, and was a resident of St. Croix, Virgin Islands. He attended Good Hope School, St. Croix Country Day School, the Pearl B. Larson School, the Manor School and graduated from Laurel Springs Academy in Ojai, California in 2003. On February 23, 2011, he pled guilty to the crime of voluntary manslaughter and was sentenced to ten (10) years' incarceration. Jeremy M. Chiuk-Davis has served nearly four (4) years of his term, is deeply remorseful for his actions that resulted in the death of another and has been a model inmate during his period of incarceration.

Taking together the facts and circumstances of the underlying conduct of the offense charged, the numerous letters of support and commendation received by my office including those who have witnessed his rehabilitation during his incarceration and the fact that Jeremy M. Chiuk-Davis has no prior criminal history, the commutation of his sentence to time served is warranted.

NOW, THEREFORE, by the powers vested in me by Section 11 of the Revised Organic Act of 1954, as amended, and for the aforementioned reasons, I, John P. de Jongh, Jr, Governor of the United States Virgin Islands, have granted and by these presents do commute the sentence of Jeremy M. Chiuk-Davis, for his conviction in the Superior Court of the Virgin Islands in case number SX-08-CR-290 to time served as of the date of this Order of Commutation. The Bureau of Corrections is hereby directed to release Jeremy M. Chiuk-Davis forthwith.
